





“The Belt”

As I was preparing the 1923 Model T Depot Hack to go on the 2019 Texas T Party Tour in Brenham I lubricated and greased every spot I could reach. When on the front spring perches the oil ran out almost as fast as I squirted it in, I decided to change the worn perches and the shackles. Oh, I gave a little thought to trying to rehabilitate them myself and had replacement sleeves on hand, but after a failed start on that path, decided to order new ones from the trusty supply house. Wise decision! The old left perch came out easily. Putting the new one in was a somewhat difficult alignment issue, but it was accomplished.

The right one was rusted in place and took a major cheater bar and WD40 to remove. But it finally came loose and was fitted into place. The front end was tight and drove very nicely.

I then turned to the distributor lubrication with just a dab of grease and noticed that the old leather belt seemed to be quite loose. Checking the adjustment bolts and rotation indicated that it was already adjusted as tight as it could be. I could turn the fan blade by hand with little if any effort. Thinking that I was running out of time to get the car ready, and giving in to my tendency to “do it myself” and worse yet to operate in “ranch mode” (town is far away so we will just make do with what we have), I decided to just make a new belt.

So first I removed the old belt and proceeded to try and figure out how to measure the size length necessary to fit and be able to be tightened. Did I measure the inside or the outside? Was I sure just how much difference the oval adjustment created? Well no, I wasn't quite sure just how long to make it or even how to tell someone else to make it, but that certainly was not going to get in my way or stop me from making a new belt.

So off I went to the Austin Shoe Repair shop in the neighborhood. I asked “Did they have any leather at this store?” No, the answer was. Well, did they have a stitcher at this store? No, said the attendant, but he did have some advice. I could go to Tandy Leather over in Capital Plaza and get some leather and then I could go to the Austin Shoe Repair on Burnet Road, where they have a stitcher to have it glued and sewn together. So off I went in my modern truck. The belt blank only cost \$27 with tax. So that did not seem too bad and off I went to Burnet Road. They said that yes they could do it, but they wanted me to in fact mark what length was needed. He for sure did not want to be responsible for the correct length which needed to be one half inch shorter than the old belt that I had with me. So I marked it with what length I wanted and was told that it would be \$ 29. Well, that was a little more than I had hoped for, but I needed the belt and they could do it, so I said yes.

But then he told me that it would be 4 days before I could get it. So we had another discussion. Finally, he asked when did I actually need it. I said that I could wait until Monday and he said that I could come and get it on Saturday. Actually they called and I picked it up on Friday. It looked good, but it was only stitched across, not quite as secure as I would have liked.
